TOUR OF MATHER COMMUNITY CAMPUS

Please join us for a tour and informational program about the County of Sacramento Department of Human Assistance Transition program. A program that provides homeless single adults and parents an opportunity to build new personal and professional lives at **Mather Community Campus (MCC)**.

MCC is a nationally recognized two-year job-training and employment program for as many as 35 families with children, and 200 single persons who were once homeless. To date, more than 2,000 adults and children have been served since MCC opened in 1995. This two year program provides housing, training, counseling and employment services to support a productive reentry into the local community. Part of this program provides building maintenance skills training and on the job training in areas of basic building maintenance, paint and patch and more.

PRIDE Industries is a committed partner with the collaborative partnership efforts currently in place at the Mather Community Campus. They are in a strong collaborative partnership with the Sacramento Area Emergency Housing Center, Sacramento County Department of Human Assistance, and Volunteers of America to train MCC Residents in Custodial and Landscaping Services, and Building Maintenance and Equipment Repair Services/Training Program. This partnership has spanned over the past eleven years and continues to be a viable option for the MCC residents seeking job and skills training leading to continuous employment.

Our commitment reaches past MCC by providing residents employment opportunities in the Sacramento area at our various PRIDE contracts, as well as additional training courses for continued development. In addition, PRIDE provides basic furniture and household needs to all MCC residents after they graduate from the program. PRIDE Industries coordinates with local businesses for donations including furniture, school supplies, books, bicycles and kitchen supplies. **PRIDE is committed to continuing our current role at the Mather Community Campus by training residents in the established Painting Technician Program.**
